








Birthday Present!

Did you know if you were born in the US you are automatically a US citizen?






HIGHEST LAW!

The constitution is the set of rules we live by in the United States. It's our highest law.






OLDER THAN GRANDMA!

The constitution was written in the hot summer of 1787 in Philadelphia. It's over 200 years old.!










FATHER JAMES!


THREE EQUAL PARTS!

The constitution outlines three separate, but EQUAL branches of our government: legislative, judicial, and executive. One is not more powerful than the other.










WHO MAKES THE LAWS?


The legislative branch is made up of the Senate and House of Representatives, elected officials from each state. The legislative branch is responsible for making laws.





WHAT THE SUPREME COURT DOES?


The judicial branch is headed by the Supreme Court and is charged with interpreting the laws. They decide the meaning of laws and whether a law breaks the rules of the constitution.



WHO DEFENDS THE CONSTITUTION?

The executive branch is headed by the president, who is responsible for enforcing laws. The president promises to protect, defend, and preserve the constitution.






PRESIDENT SWEARS!

The presidential "Oath or Affirmation" in the Constitution reads: "I do solemnly swear (or affirm) that I will faithfully execute the Office of the President of the United States, and will to the best of my Ability, preserve, protect and defend the Constitution of the United States."





WHAT IS THE BILL OF RIGHTS?

The Bill of Rights lists many rights or liberties of the people of the United States of America. It is the first ten amendments (or changes) to the constitution.
