

Author Visit Activity Guide

Debbie Dadey is coming to your school and you want to get ready. Here are a few fun ideas to get you started. Don't forget to check out www.debbiedadey.com for more ideas.

- 1. Read several of Debbie Dadey's books so students will be familiar with her before the visit.
- 2. Visit Debbie Dadey's teacher's page for lots of teaching units and activities.

- 4. The entire school could wear real or make paper pink sunglasses for *Pirates Don't Wear Pink Sunglasses* and write like a pirate at http://www.debbiedadey.com/upload/Sparkle_Tales/MermaidTaleActivities/WriteLikeAPirate.pdf
- 5. Use the Starfish Writing Element sheet to create your own story. http://www.debbiedadey.com/upload/Sparkle_Tales/MermaidTaleActivities/StarfishStoryElements.pdf
- 6. Turn your entire school into Debbie Dadey land with each classroom centering on a book. Each classroom's door could be a mini-bulletin board. For instance, the art room could be *Aliens Don't Wear Braces*. In that room you could draw aliens or learn about different planets or turn the room into a mini planetarium. In another room, a nurse could check your germs to go along with *Martians Don't Take Temperatures*. A dog trainer showing dogs doing tricks could be in another room for several of Debbie's books, including The Barkley School for Dogs series. A football hero could talk about his career or even play the game with the kids for *Bogeymen Don't Play Football*. The possibilities are endless and so it the fun!
- 7. Have a Bailey School Kids dress-up day. Let each student pick their favorite character. Activities could include a parade and students could write a character sketch.
- 8. Have students line up outside the school for Debbie's arrival with signs and cheers. The local TV station loves this sort of thing.
- 9. Students can make their own 'wax' museum. The students could dress as their favorite characters and attach a paper button to their costumes. Invite other classes to the museum. When the other kids push their 'buttons' the 'wax' students could recite a bit about their character and a book they are in.

- 10. Invite the whole school to wear polka-dots for Vampires Don't Wear Polka Dots.
- 13. Know someone who can teach your students how to throw a lasso? This is an awesome way to introduce the picture book, *Will Rogers, Larger Than Life*.
- 14. Invite a Native American person from your community to share items or stories from their culture to introduce *Cherokee Sister*. A local music store or the library may have Cherokee music for you to share with your students.
- 15. Younger students may enjoy bringing their stuffed pet animals for a 'dog show' to go along with *Kilmer's Pet Monster* or the Barkley books.
 - 16. Have a talent show to top off Triplet Trouble and the Talent Show Mess.
- 17. Make cookies to culminate *Triplet Trouble and the Cookie Contest* or *The Bride of Frankenstein Doesn't Bake Cookies*.
- 18. Make up your own tall tale to go along with *Shooting Star*, *Annie Oakley the Legend*.
- 19. Declare a 'kootie free' day. Everyone must write or tell nice things to the people in their class. Teachers should do a kootie check before any notes are shared and read *King of the Kooties*.
- 20. Make a Dracula lemonade stand for lunch or recess fun to go along with *Dracula Doesn't Drink Pink Lemonade*.
- 21. Teaching square dancing is a fun tie-in for *Bigfoot Doesn't Square Dance*.
- 22. Your students have great ideas. Let them think up a new Bailey School Kids book. Have a contest!
- 23. Wolfman Don't Hula Dance is the perfect excuse to have a luau. Take time to play fun music, dress in flower shirts, learn about Hawaii, and even take hula lessons!
- 24. For *Elves Don't Wear Hardhats*, let your students design the perfect playground.
- 25. Teach your students about the space program when reading *Mrs*. *Jeepers in Outer Space*. If possible, contact NASA for their traveling exhibit or invite an astronaut for a visit (or go on a field trip!)
- 26. For *Angels Don't Know Karate*, invite a local karate instructor for a demonstration.
- 27. Have your own mini field day for *Triplet Trouble and the Field Day Disaster*.
- 28. Have students create their own maps of magical worlds like the one found in the Keyholder series or the underwater world in Mermaid Tales.
