



### **Pre-reading activities:**

Before reading *Battle of the Best Friends* complete some or all of the activities below to peak interest in the story, as well as to increase comprehension, reading, and predicting skills.

- 1. Ask students to tell you what they know about musical bands. Tell them they are going to read a story with a boy band named The Corals. Ask them to suggest names for their own band. Ask them what instruments should be in a band.
- 2. Ask students to guess what a Shell Wars game would be like. Let them come up with their own rules.
- 3. Ask students if they think it is fair to invite everyone but a few people in a classroom to a party. After reading the book, plan a Non-Coral party!





# FUN WAYS TO LEARN VOCABULARY WORDS FOR BATTLE OF THE BEST FRIENDS



- Assign one word to each student. Give them time to define the word and then let each student orally share their word's meaning.
- Go around the room and let kids do a 'vocabulary bee' where they must use one of the vocabulary words in a sentence or sit down.
- Let kids put their words in spelling boxes by drawing a rectangle and putting the word in it. Now, separate each syllable inside the boxes.
   Remind students that every box much have a vowel.
- Let students make their own paper shells and put a vocabulary word on each side. Use them to decorate the classroom door. Upon entering the room students must touch a shell and say a word.
- Have a word race. Call out the word and let students race to find the word in the chapter.
- Have students put the vocabulary words in the right column: verb, noun, adjective, or adverb.
